Editorial Articles.

An Historic Business.

THE OLD-ESTABLISHED BUSINESS of S. Maw, Son & Sons, Druggists and Chemists, 11 Aldergate Street, London, E.C., which has so long been conducted into a private and limited company (i.e. 37), has been established over a hundred years. The following dates show the steps in the evolution of the business, which has grown in size and scope with the passing years:

- 1807. Geo. Maw enters into partnership with his cousin, William Horroyd, at 50 Fenchurch Street.
- 1814. Geo. Maw withdraws from the partnership and purchased the business of John Lowe, surgical-instrument-maker, 49 Whitecross Street.
- 1820. Larger premises acquired at 55 Aldergate Street.
- 1825. Geo. Maw's eldest son, John Horsey Maw, became a partner, the style of the firm being Geo. Maw & Son.
- 1828. Geo. Maw retired, and his youngest son Solomon Maw joined the firm, the name being then changed to J. & S. Maw.
- 1834. Business moved to 11 Aldergate Street.
- 1835. John Horsey Maw retired from the firm.
- 1844. Solomon Maw took a Mr. Stevenson into partnership, but the latter died within a few months.
- 1846. Premises burnt down.
- 1850. Charles Maw, son of Solomon Maw, admitted a partner, the firm becoming S. Maw & Sons.
- 1861. Solomon Maw died.
- 1870. John Thompson joined into partnership, the firm name becoming S. Maw, Son & Thompson.
- 1877. Present Aldergate Street frontage acquired, rebuilding completed in 1878.
- 1890. John Thompson retired, and Henry T. Maw, M.D., admitted partner. Chas. Trumham Maw and Mowbray T. Maw were already partners.
- 1905. Chas. Maw died and Arthur T. Maw, Ph.D., joined a partner, the firm name of S. Maw, Son & Sons being adopted.
- 1917. The business converted into a private limited company. The partners became directors, with the addition of A. F. Porter, general manager.

The conversion has been brought about for family reasons, and will not affect the management or conduct of the business. Mr. Porter, the general manager, who joins the company as a director, has been associated with the business for twenty-five years.
